

Indian Dance Trophy Given Arrow Chief

HERKIMER — Alan Kennell, Ilion, 1955 chief of Kamargo Lodge, Order of the Arrow, was presented with a trophy from the National Council, Boy Scouts of America, at the second annual banquet of the lodge in Prospect Hotel here Thursday night.

The trophy, which was presented by Arthur H. Turner, president of General Herkimer Boy Scout Council, was awarded to Kennell for winning individual honors in the Indian dance competition at the Scout Executive Conference in Michigan last September.

George Purple, Ilion superintendent of schools, congratulated lodge members for their accomplishments in 1955 and said they are "an outstanding group of young American men." He urged them to continue to set the excellent example for others as they have done in the past.
