On October 14 - 16 the Fall Fellowship Weekend will be held at Treasure Island. The weekend program will include inter - chapter competition in campcraft and other outdoor skills.

The program, beginning at 2:00 PM will feature a demonstration by John Ott and Butch Rogachenko. In addition Roy Temper will instruct on scuba and marine skills. Other demonstrations will include a special presentation on skiing and spelunking. Demonstrations are fine, but eager Arrowmen will want to get in the swim of things and they will! Swimming, volleyball, basketball and other sports will be available to all. Chapters should begin NOW to organize teams for these sports and other interchapter competition. New Arrowmen will get a chance to meet the Chapter Chief and Lodge Officers. A final training session for the promotion of Operation 300 will be included in the program. The program will wind up with dinner.

In addition to inter-chapter competition, an Indian lore orientation will be presented. The presentation will include Indian dancing, costuming, etc. Arrowmen will also have an opportunity for camp service. A special attraction awaits Arrowmen Saturday night at the social. The program will end Sunday afternoon at a banquet and Lodge meeting.

The weekend cost is \$3.50 until October 1. After October 1 the reservation fee will be \$4.00. All Arrowmen attending the weekend will receive a patch. This patch will be the 4th in a series of six Unami Patches featuring the Kachina doll. These patches are only sold at the respective activity for which they are designated

All Arrowmen are invited to attend. The cost is 25¢ for old members. New members will be the guest of Unami Lodge. All Lodge properties will be on sale. Remember to wear your uniform & Arrowband.

William Penn Charter School is located between Wissahickon and Henry Aves. on Schoolhouse Lane. The school can easily be reached by public transportation by taking the "A" bus to Schoolhouse Lane on Henry Ave., then walk one block west.

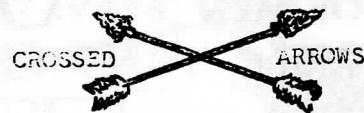
SET ASIDE FOR THOSE WHO

Those members of Unami Lodge who show their willingness to continue in the same spirit of cheerful service and camping that warrented their election to the Ordeal are eligible to apply for Brotherhood Membership in the Order. After at least ten months of active participation in your unit, chapter lodge and in Scouting in general, you are invited to apply for Brotherhood Membership by sending your completed Brotherhood Scorecard to the Scout Service Center. Shortly after your scorecard has been received, you will be notified to come before a reviewing committee who will discuss and review your service record with you. If your record of service is found to be exemplary of the Brotherhood Membership, you will be permitted to take the Brotherhood.

The Brotherhood Honor occupies a high place in Scouting and in the Order, and is specifically reserved for those Arrowmen who continue faithfully in the cheerful service of their fellowman.

Because of work and other personal obligations, not all Arrowmen are fortunate enough to be able to give the Order of the Arrow and Scouting the time and service needed to be worthy of the Brotherhood Honor. However, if you have continued diligently in your cheerful service for at least ten months after your Ordeal induction, why not avail yourself of the opportunity to receive an honor you rightfully deserve.

The next Brotherhood will be conducted at the Fall Fellowship Weekend on October 14-16 at Treasure Island. Completed Brotherhood scorecards should be forwarded to the Scout Service Center no later than October 8. 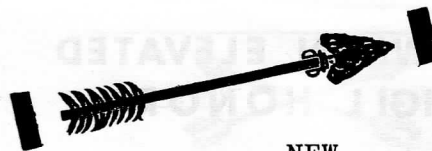
