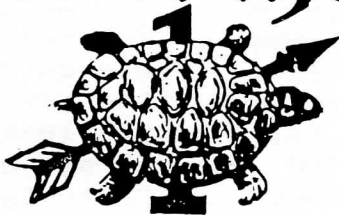

The trip was excellent, due to the superb seating arrangements provided by Piedmont Airlines. Upon arrival, we checked in and proceeded to our dorms.

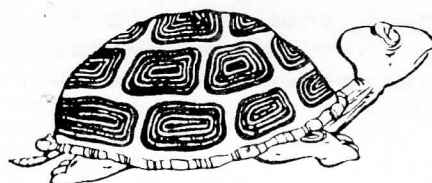
The weekend was filled with exciting events such as golfing, movies, arcade center, patch trading, and Nicks Wagon Wheel. Who could ever forget Nick's?????

The total lodge membership to date is 1046 brothers. This figure is down slightly, but if you all pay your dues for 1987, I am sure our membership will increase.

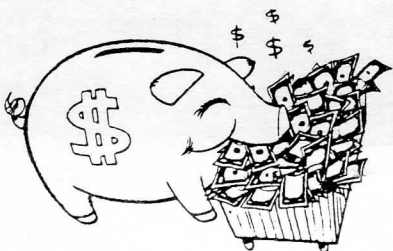
FINANCE
