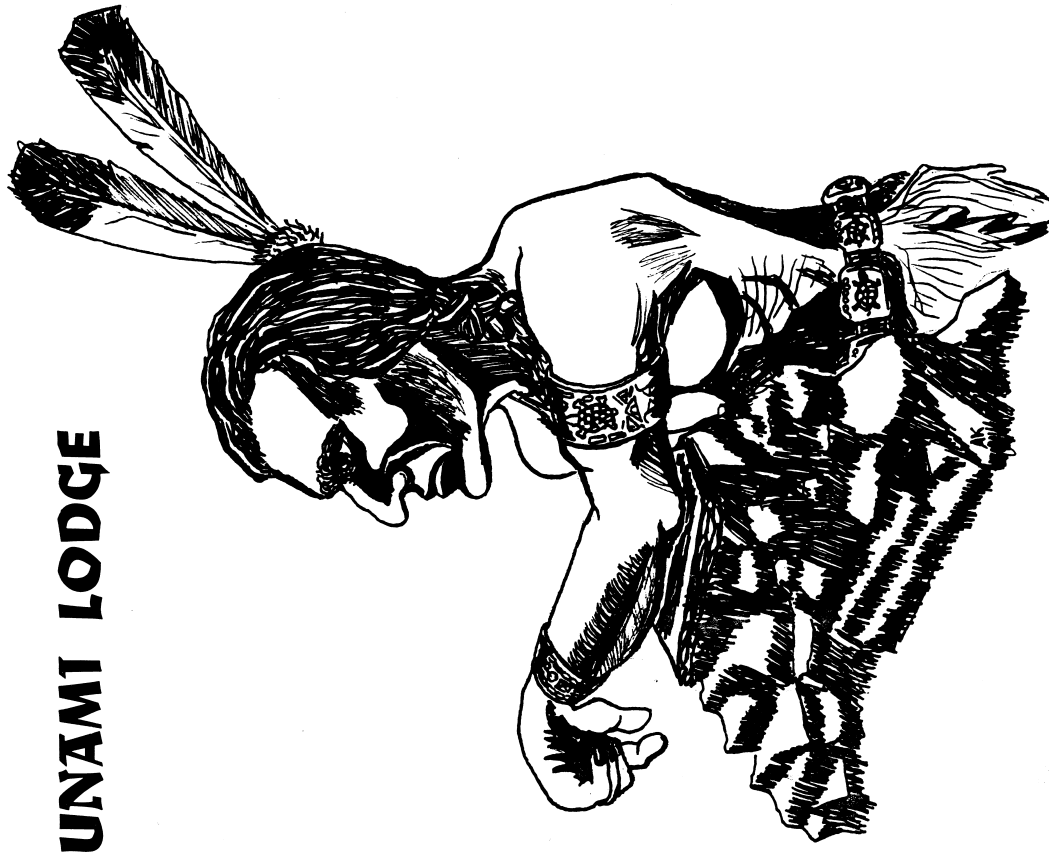

HIGHLIGHTS OF 1958

Members of the Activities, Ordeal and Service Committees have done an outstanding job during the year. Service was maintained throughout the year and a record number of brothers were inducted into our lodge.

In April, we held our first weekend of the year at Resica Falls. This weekend was attended by many hard working brothers. Our Spring Meeting was held at Treasure Island in May. Even though service was not our prime purpose on the weekend we still found time to lend a helping hand in preparation for Summer Camp.

A delegation from Unami attended the area IIA Meeting at Camp Irexler. Those who attended shared many new ideas upon their return.

August was the chosen month to induct nine brothers into the Vigil Honor. Many brothers followed the trail to Resica Falls in September for another outstanding Service Weekend. This was followed by the Fall meeting in October at Treasure Island.

On the night of November 15, a grand feast was held at Breyer Training Area, which was attended by many new and old members. Orientation and fellowship were the main points of the program. By the way, we called this activity the Reception for New Members.

The successfulness of these activities and projects would not have been possible without your efforts and attendance.

Let's make 1959 a greater year for UNAMI.

REPORT OF THE ALUMNI COMMITTEE - George Deal

The Alumni Committee was created this year for the purpose of getting more of the senior members interested in attending the lodge programs and to get the inactive members active again in the lodge and in Scouting.

Contact was made by phone and card to different members who have not attended recent lodge functions. The Executive Committee cooperated by making similar contacts. The District Chapters were requested to form a District Alumni Committee to handle their own inactive members.

It was suggested that an evening at Breyer Training Area or a weekend at one of our Camps be considered, for the purpose of bringing out the inactive members.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SCRIBE - Carl Jeremias

The Executive Scribe reports that 469 new members were inducted into the Lodge during 1958, making a total number of 8915 members inducted into Unami Lodge since its organization.

At the present time there are 2199 yearly dues-paying members, and 700 Life Members for a total of 2902 members on the active rolls. Of this total membership, there are 2154 Ordeal members, 647 Brotherhood members and 101 Vigil Honor Members.

From all available information we have a record of 42 members in the Armed Services.

During 1958, eight members purchased Life memberships and 64 inactive members were reinstated to active membership.

Every effort is being made to keep the addressograph list accurate, to insure members of receiving mail. It will help greatly if members will notify the Executive Scribe promptly of any change of address. Also, it will be appreciated if members who have been discharged from the Service will so notify the Executive Scribe.

Bills for yearly dues will be mailed during the month of January. Members should remit promptly. Members who have not paid dues for the two years of 1957 and 1958 will be dropped from active membership and the mailing list as of January 1, 1959.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COSTUMES AND TEAMS COMMITTEE - Joseph Chapman

This committee provides costumes and other necessary equipment for lodge induction ceremonies and other ceremonies in which the lodge might participate. The committee also provides costumes for the Council's Summer Camps for the Order of the Arrow program and for other Council activities as the occasion arises. The committee repairs old costumes as necessary, purchases new material, and trains team members in their parts. Teams for all Ordeal and Brotherhood ceremonies are supplied by the Committee.

The Costumes committee has spent over \$200 this year in purchasing new materials and replacing worn objects. Several rather expensive items have been purchased this year in an effort to provide the first lodge in the country with a truly fine set of costumes. Some of these items went with the delegates to the National Meeting this year in Kansas.

As the costumes are in use during the entire year, replacement is frequently necessary. This means that the Committee has the job of providing these replacements as necessary. Cognizance of this fact and cooperation of the membership will insure the lodge costumes and teams of which it can be proud.

## DISTRICT CHAPTERS AND UNIT CHAPTERS - C. V. Clerke

During the year, 1958 six Districts have had organized Chapters. The chapters are chartered in the Woodland, Northern, Northwest, Keystone, Delaware and Frontier Districts. During December of this year, Ben Franklin District organized their chapter and elected officers. All the established chapters had fine activities including Chapter weekends and social affairs. Early in the coming year, Conestoga and Philenape Districts should have chartered Chapters.

Although there are at present only a small number of Unit Chapters, interest here too seems to be rising.

I would like to take this time to thank all those who have helped me as members of my committee, and to wish the best of luck to all Chapters in the Coming Year.

## VIGIL HONOR COMMITTEE - Martin Leicht

## BROTHERHOOD COMMITTEE - Walter Goering

Total brothers inducted into the Brotherhood was 121. Sixty-seven were inducted at Lodge weekends held by Unami Lodge. Twenty-two were inducted at Northwest Chapter weekends, three in Northern, five in Keystone Chapter and twenty-four from Delaware and Frontier Chapters.

## ORDEAL COMMITTEE - Warren Tudgey

The grand total of members inducted into the Ordeal was five hundred and sixty-seven. Eighty-two at Unami Lodge weekends, four hundred and fifty at Summer Camp, twelve from Northwest, seventeen from Delaware Chapter and two from Keystone Chapter.

## NORTHERN CHAPTER - Gerald Cochran, Chief

Northern District had a weekend on November 7-9, 1958 at Hart Scout Reservation. Twenty-five brothers were present. Four Ordeal and three Brotherhood candidates were inducted. The following service projects were completed: Shingles of cabins and leantos were stained; dining hall railing was scraped and painted; window sashes of Unami Lodge and Trading Post were painted, metal braces for the tent frames were scraped and painted.

During 1958, Northern District gave service to the Lodge by mailing the Voice of the Turtle. About twenty-five brothers participated throughout the year.

The Chapter had \$16.34 in its mailing fund and \$20.00 in the costume fund. The number of brothers in the chapter are 246.

In January there will be a meeting for the election of officers. The date will be announced later.

Membership participation in the chapter is fair. However, a method to get more brothers active has not yet been decided.

One of the most important activities of the chapter is the formation of a ceremonial team for units in the District for Courts of Honor, etc. The Chapter has recently purchased \$80.00 worth of costumes for the ceremonial team.

KEYSTONE CHAPTER - Tony Schmidt, Chief

Nineteen fifty eight has been a very successful one for Keystone Chapter. Two Ordeal weekends were held, inducting a total of sixteen Ordeal and five Brotherhood members.
