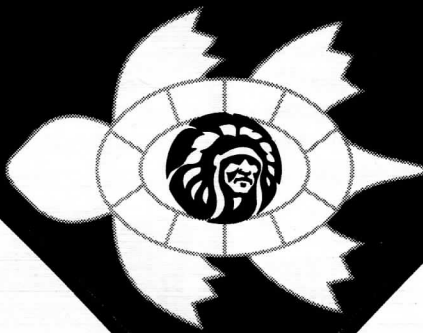

## Challenge to arrowmen made with 75th Awards

1990 marks the seventy-fifth year that Unami Lodge and the Order of the Arrow have been in existence. You too can be a part of this historical year by earning the National and Lodge Participation Awards and attending the Anniversary Weekend.

The National 75th Anniversary Award challenges arrowmen in three areas: a quest for chapter and lodge development, a quest for scouting and community development and a quest for personal development. The require-

ments for this award are listed on cards (green for youth; gray for adults) which can be obtained at all lodge functions and chapter meetings. These requirements can be completed anytime between August, 1988 and August, 1990. The award is a handsome ribbon pin which is presented during a special Rededication Ceremony at lodge events.

Lodge members are also challenged to earn the Unami Lodge Participation Award. This award covers a brother's

involvement in all aspects of lodge activities. The requirements are listed on a white card which can be obtained at lodge events and chapter meetings. Upon completion, the arrowmen will receive a special certificate and have the privilege to purchase a unique patch reserved only for those who earn the award. All requirements for the Unami Award must be completed during 1990.

Those arrowmen who were inducted into the OA during the 1989 Summer Camp Season, at the 1989 Spring Service or anytime prior to those events are eligible now. The requirements are also listed in the current OA Handbook.

Ordeal members cannot grasp the full understanding of their ordeal or the Order of the Arrow until they complete the Brotherhood. Therefore, seek to fulfill the challenge of Allowat Sakima, "Strengthen the ties of Brotherhood, build upon the fire of cheerfulness, lift the burdens from the shoulders of your fellow scouts. When you have done these things, you will again find yourself before me, prepared to see the full meaning of the arrow."

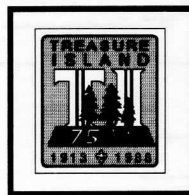

## This Old Camp — July 8 - 14

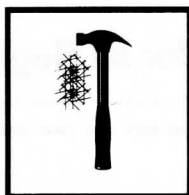

# Vigil Honor: Selection process to begin

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor which a lodge can bestow upon a member. It is given for outstanding service to the lodge and council. It dates back to 1915 when our founder, Dr. E. Urner Goodman, became the first Vigil Honor member. The Vigil Honor is a mark of high distinction and recognition reserved for those arrowmen who have given exceptional service by helping others beyond the call of duty, involving unselfish dedication to one or more of the following: their lodge, the Order of the Arrow, Scouting or their Scout camp. Alertness to the needs of others is a mark of the Vigil Honor.

Nominations for the Vigil Honor are not to be taken lightly. You must provide as much information as possible so that the Vigil Honor Committee can make a fair assessment of the arrowman's contributions to Scouting and the OA. To be eligible for nomination, an arrowman must be a member in good standing and brotherhood for at least two years.

Nomination forms can be obtained at chapter meetings, in the Trading Post of the Council Service Center or by calling the Vigil Honor Chairman, Frank Herrmann.

All arrowmen are welcome to attend the Vigil Honor Committee Selection Meeting which will be held on May 21 at the Council Service Center starting at 7:00. This meeting is the deadline for all nominations.

## Earn the National Camping Award

The National Camping Award is given to troops that have an effective outdoor program during a 12 month period. The requirements are listed below.

1. Patrol Activities: Each patrol of the troop participated in at least three of the following during the last 12 months:

- Attend a Camporee.
- Held a Day Hike.
- Did a Conservation Hike.
- Attended a Scout Retreat.
- Conducted a Project for BSA Anniversary Week.
- Conducted a Father and Son Camping Trip.

2. Short Term Camping: All patrols in the troop were represented in four or more short-term camp outs during the past 12 months.

3. Long Term Camping: All patrols in the troop were represented in a long-term (6 or more consecutive days) camp and at least 50 percent of the total boy membership of the troop attended.

Since an arrowman's first duty is to his home unit, let's all do our best to earn the National Camping Award!
