CANOE TRIP

NOW is the time to include "The Unami White Water Canoe Trip" in your calendar of activities. The week-long canoe trip will extend from Saturday, August 27 through Saturday, September 4, 1966.



Who is eligible? All Unami Lodge Brothers who are under twenty-one years of age and who qualify at the Paddle-Rama shakedown weekend, June 25 and 26, 1966. This is a "High Adventure Trip." Only experienced canoeists will be accepted. Experienced canoeists may obtain the "Certificate of Completion" at the Treasure Island Aquatic Week, June 27 through July 1, 1966.

Arrowmen will participate in seven days and nights of camping, canoeing, swimming, and fishing. Extra activities will include a glorious evening with Girl Scouts including a barn dance and hayride. A conservation project will also be part of the agenda. Various historical points of interest will be seen by the eager canoeists as they glide upon the upper Delaware. An Awards Banquet will conclude the trip at Treasure Island.

The canoes will be launched into the Delaware River at about Narrowsburg, New York and docked at Easton, Pennsylvania.

The leaders of the trip are Dr. Robert Suter, an experienced canoeist and Scouter, who is the Advisor and also coordinating the planning; and, Mr. John Ott, Camp Staff Aquatic Director, who will head up an experienced staff of scout canoeists in planning and leading the trip as Trip Event Director.

How much will it cost? The fee has been set at \$50.00, for which you receive all of the following:

1. The aquatic certification week at Treasure Island.
2. The full canoe trip.
3. All trip patches, the Fifty-Miler Award, and a souvenir paddle to each participant.
