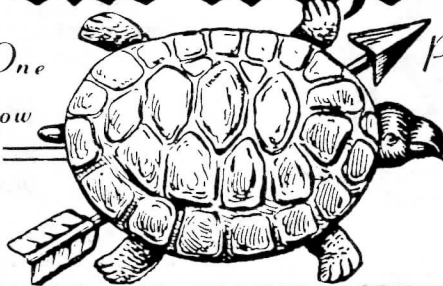
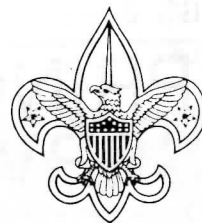

FUN AND FROLICS AT FALL FELLOWSHIP WEEKEND

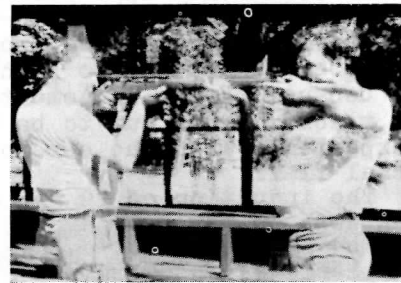

UNITY

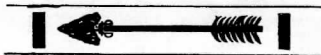
We meet the second Tuesday of every month at 2330 West Allegheny Avenue.
