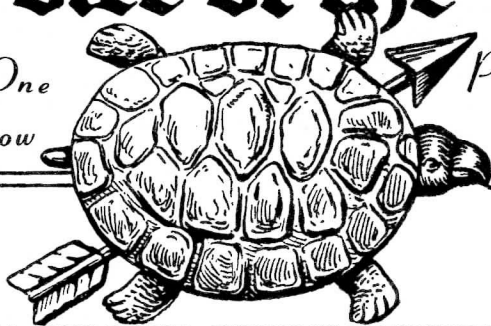

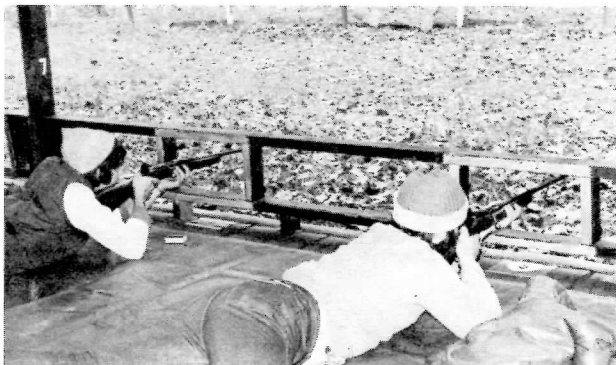

SECTION 5-A CONCLAVE



Twenty-seven delegates from Unami attended the 1977 Section 5 - A Conclave, on June 10 - 12, at Ockanickon Scout Reservation. The theme for this conclave was: "Dedicated To Serve." To start off the program on Friday night, a flap auction was held in the dining hall to raise funds for Section 5 - A. The fast-talking auctioneer was none other than our own Bill Scott, who really kept things moving.

Saturday morning was devoted to the training aspect of the weekend as the thought exchange groups gathered. Afterwards, the delegates watched the Individual Indian Dance Competition. After lunch, all of the lodges competed in afternoon competitions including swimming, nature, and volleyball. Unami brought home a first place gold medal in chess thanks to Ray Rosenberger, a gold medal in Ping-Pong, thanks to Rick Levin, and a bronze medal in Canoeing through the efforts of Steve Feinberg and Rick Levin.

One thing that made this weekend outstanding was the honor of having on hand, the National Chief, Chris Boswell. Chris conducted a forum in the afternoon at which the delegates had the opportunity to ask some interesting questions concerning national policies.

At dinner on Saturday night, the meal which Unami hosted, Morgan Thomas presented a birthday cake to Ajapeu Lodge on behalf of Unami and Section 5-A. After the meal, Unami presented an unbelievable rendition of one of our old favorites, "Cock Robin." Dressed in outlandish get-up and combining terrible acting ability with the story-song, Unami had everyone in the dining hall laughing and cheering. We even managed to pull the Section and National Chiefs into the closing chorus line. By the way, our own lay advisor, Gene Lorandean, did a fantastic job as the widow of Cock Robin, Shrieking, wailing, and squirting people with a water pistol. Gene has reserved himself a role in any future productions.

After dinner, the section was treated to a fine display of Indian Dancing at the Dance Team Competition. Later, at retreat, Unami once again showed that we are #1 by capturing first place in the Section Newsletter Competition for our publication, "The Voice of the Turtle." This award, judged by T.V. Guide, has now been won by Unami for four straight years.



At the campfire that night, Unami performed a skit that was really enjoyed by all of the delegates. Following the campfire, the section held the traditional Fellowship Feast. This is a large social where each lodge serves the particular dish that it's area is known for. Unami served snapper soup. Among some of the other foods were ice cream sundaes, shoe-fly pie, sugar cake, home-made cream soda, funnel cake, potato pancakes, pickled mushrooms, and rock candy. How does that sound for a combination?

A special surprise at the feast was the appearance of our own Steve Feinberg dressed up in an upporious turtle costume, urging delegates (some by brute force) to sample some of our soup.

On Sunday morning after breakfast, the Section business meeting was convened at which the elections for Section officers were held. Re-elected as Section Chief was Kevin McDermott from Octoraro #22. The new Section Vice-Chief is Ben Carpenetti from Wunita Gokhos #39 and Unami's Steve Kotzen is the new Section Secretary.

At lunch, Unami again made it's mark by winning the Section Display Award for our display about the production of The Voice of the Turtle.

After the closing ceremony on Sunday afternoon, each lodge went it's separate way. Everyone who attended will long remember this eventful weekend.



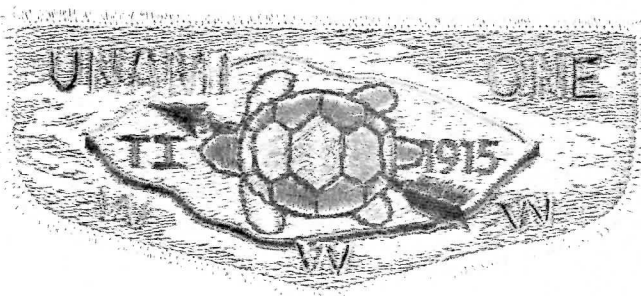
WHAT'S NEW???

On the flap, is a drawing of T.I. in green and brown, with light and dark blue water surrounding the island. 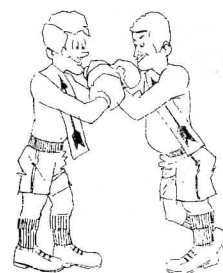
The flap has become an item in large demand among all arrowmen. In fact, because of the demand, the supply has already been exhausted. Additional flaps are being ordered, and will soon be available.



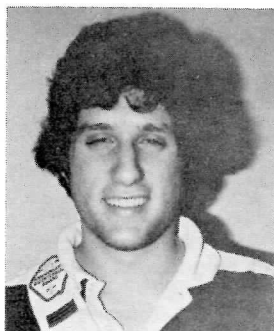
OFFICER ELECTIONS

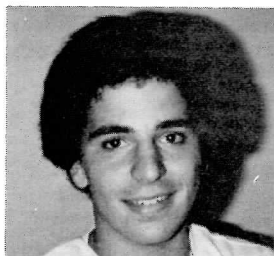

Another copy was presented to Troop 123, sponsored by the Overbrook School for the Blind, for the use of the Arrowmen in their unit. The third copy is kept at the Scout Service Center for the use of any other blind Arrowmen in the area. It is our sincere hope that through the national presentation at the conference, other lodges will concern themselves with the same need in their areas by contacting the national office for more information on the production of their own copies of the handbook. This production is truly in keeping with the spirit of the 1937 Unami Lodge Service Committee, which produced the first Boy Scout Handbook in Braille.

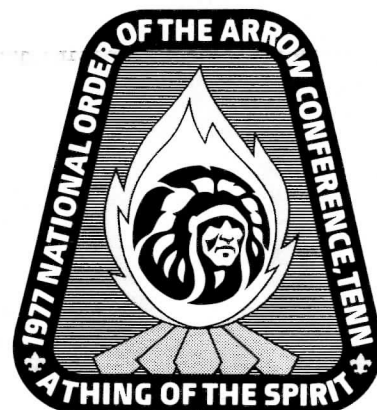
