Fall Fellowship

Unami Lodge has successfully completed the 1975 Fall Fellowship Weekend at Hart Scout Reservation, October 24, 25 and 26. Though many difficulties faced "Beef" Stu Lerman, chairman of the Weekend, and his staff, they were able to satisfy almost all of the needs of their Brothers.

Many projects were done over the weekend by both the Ordeal candidates, numbering fifty-four, and the other Lodge members who attended. The projects ranged from sanding doors, painting, and electrical contracting in the program bay, to clearing vines, filling potholes in the main road, and chipping wood. The Lodge members work three hours on their projects which consisted of clearing trails on the camp's grounds and doing other odds and ends.

Approximately 250 people attended the Weekend, not including the Ordeal candidates, and they slept in campsites designated for their chapters. Out of those 250 members, 25 attained Brotherhood, while 4 reached the peak of Vigil Honor. Following the Brotherhood and Ordeal ceremonies, there was a social at which cheese, pepperoni, crackers, and popcorn were served. The main attractions at the social were highlights from the 1974 Stanley Cup Playoffs, featuring the Flyers, and a Laurel and Hardy film, The Music Box. Highlights from the Eagles were shown after lunch on Saturday.

During the social, the ballot box for Lodge officers was open. After the social, Alan Geller and his nominating committee, tallied the votes. The winners were announced during breakfast Sunday morning. The new Lodge Chief is Gary Lewis, assisted by First Vice-Chief Bill Scott, and Second Vice-Chief Morgan Thomas. Joe Shaddack, a lone candidate, ran away with the position of Secretary, while Brotherly Love still stands, as Marc Benshetler took the job of Treasurer from his brother.

Lodge members ate well during their stay due to the superb cooking of Pop Doyle and his crew in the kitchen. If they didn't enjoy the meals, boating in Unami Creek and shooting the rifles should have satisfied them. There was an inter-chapter rifle shoot-out and Delaware Chapter tied Frontier chapter.

Since food was short because of those members who attended without registering, the staff has asked that if you do not receive a "Voice of the Turtle," and would like to attend a Lodge event, you are asked to notify Scout Headquarters at LO-4-2540, to place your reservation. This will solve the problem of people not eating because there was not enough food ordered in the beginning for them.

Despite the rain, all those who attended had a wonderful time. They will be receiving their patches within a few weeks in the envelope they addressed. Congratulations to the new Lodge officers.

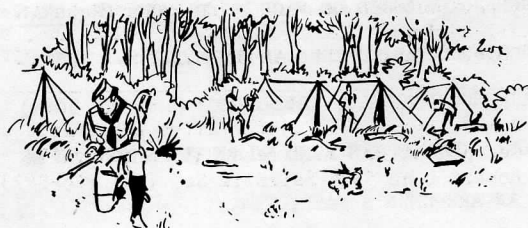

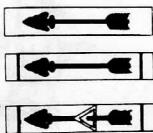
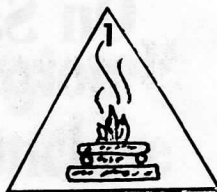
Camp Promo

SCORECARD FOR ARROWMEN



CUT-OUT AND FOLD

Award Requirements

This award can be earned by Arrowmen under 21. The award can be worn only on the OA sash, sewn with its lower edge one-half inch above the upper Brotherhood bar (or, for Ordeal members, above the tip of the arrowhead). Only one award is available per member. It is not to be traded.

To qualify for this award, an Arrowman (under 21) must complete by June 14, 1977, 11 of the 15 requirements, including six (6) mandatory ones—the five with asterisks and an additional one in section II. Awards must be earned, but not necessarily received, before an Arrowman turns 21. Any requirements already completed, Brotherhood or a specific merit badge or religious award, can be counted toward this OA award. Submit the scorecard to your lodge officials.
