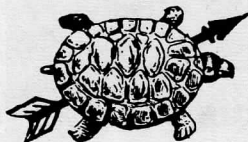

SPRING FELLOWSHIP SPECTACULAR SUCCESS LODGE ADVISER POSITION CHANGES HANDS

SPRING FELLOWSHIP

The highly successful and enjoyable Spring Fellowship of Unami Lodge was held on April 25, 26, and 27 at Hart Scout Reservation. The weekend was highlighted by chapter competitions, a Marine Corps helicopter landing, a special hootenany, and lots of great food.

The chapter competitions were the hit of the weekend for most of the Arrowmen attending. Everyone enthusiastically participated in the games, and after a hard-fought competition, Philenape Chapter emerged victorious and had its name inscribed on the permanent plaque which will hang at Hart Scout Reservation.

The helicopter, piloted by Captain Skinner, U.S.M.C., landed at Hart on Sunday morning and a Marine squad commanded by Lieutenant P. L. Carlson, aide to General Butcher, gave a demonstration of invasion and survival techniques.

Three enthusiastic folk-singers from Drexel entertained the Arrowmen at the special hootenany on Saturday and were highly appreciated by all.

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"BE CRAZY ABOUT CAMPING"

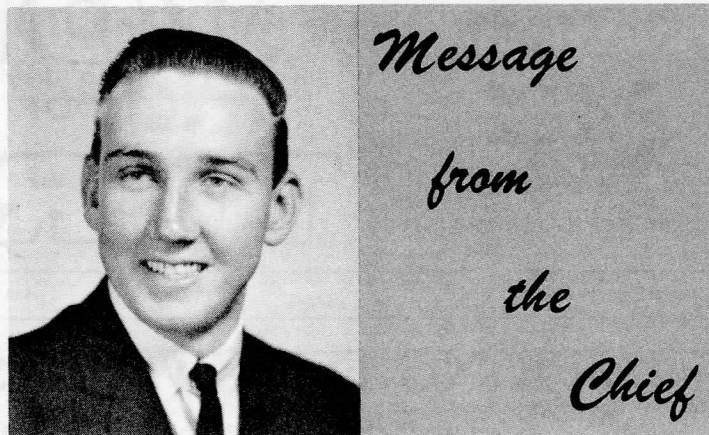
