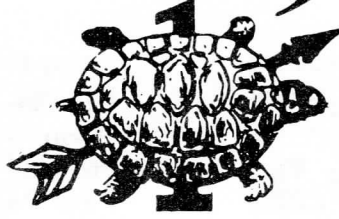

CROSSED ARROWS


