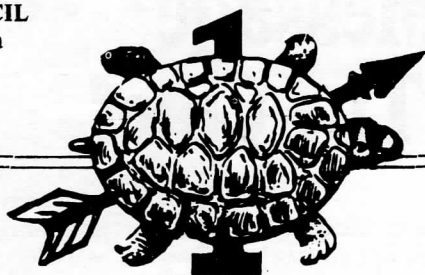

But in all modesty I must say that there has been some progress in our Lodge. To begin, there was the little job of mailing out 10,000 Camp Comics to the Scouts of Philadelphia; and with the grateful help of the Women's Scouter Reserve this task was accomplished.

The Frontier District Camporee was one of the more proud moments in Unami's history. It was here that an O.A. chapter completely ran their district camporee; an accomplishment waiting for any of our chapters who have the desire.

Two other events which showed our council our willingness to serve were the Explorer Coed Weekend, in which Lodge Brothers operated the kitchen crew; and Webelos Day, where 20 or so Brothers managed many of the vital activities that made the day the success it was.

Chronologically then came the annual Section 5-A Conclave at Camp Horseshoe on the Mason-Dixon Line; which gave Eastern Penna. the opportunity to see the Number One Lodge in action. Our spirit, our fellowship, and our togetherness showed the Section a Lodge of true Brothers that would last for quite some time to come.

At the Spring Work Weekend, where the Turtle came back, it was evident that our Brothers, although attendance was done, could willingly serve their fellowman.

Summer camp came and went with great strides in our work toward Camp Hart and Eagle Island, not to mention the Lodge House and Ceremonial Grounds.

Then came the fun-filled Fall Fellowship, the activity I hope I will always remember as long as I live. It was here that nearly 300 Brothers came together to do service, have fun, and to see some of the greatest ceremonies ever to greet a candidate's eyes. It is at this preliminary training that the O.A. will formally be indoctrinated into the council's Campmaster Corps. And finally, another event that lies in the future, our Annual Dinner/Meeting. I have seen the plans and do believe it will be a great success; it is here that the new Lodge Chief, Phil Hittner, and his officers will be inducted, not to mention the induction of the much demanded Brotherhood patch.

So many times I have stood before you and complained about the status of **OUR** Lodge. From here I can do no more complaining, however, maybe I don't have to yell so loud anymore. I believe the spark has been ignited and that, in the year to come, may burst into a blazing council fire. Brothers, it is all up to you which way we go. If only you would give the Lodge one chance, you would see how much fun and satisfaction are to be found in our Order; ask any of the Brothers who attended our weekends or the Conclave this year, they know.

Our future looks better than ever; an improved Service Corps, a developed Campmaster Corps, program helps for troops in all the Scouting skills, and much much more.
