As Oct. 16, 17, and 18 draw near all the pageantry, glamour, and excitement of the Fall Fellowship Weekend seem all the closer.

Our honored guest "Green - Bar Bill" Hillcourt will take his Brotherhood at Treasure Island during the Weekend. Also, he'll present an unusual preview of his new book, "Baden-Powell -- The Two Lives of a Hero". Bill, the National Director of Scoutcraft is well known for his books and articles on campcraft, nature, conservation, and other scoutcraft subjects. He is contributing editor of BOYS' LIFE.

The weekend program is packed with activities and events based on the theme of Indian Lore. Friday evening check-in and registration will begin at 6:00 P.M. followed by a cracker barrel. Among the events scheduled for Saturday will be a "County Fair". The "County Fair" will be held on the parade grounds at Treasure Island. Around the perimeter of the parade grounds there will be booths set up for displays, etc. There will be three categories in which a Chapter, group of individual Arrowmen, or Executive Committee members may enter. pating, here slides, pictures, Indian relics, etc. may be exhibited in a booth. In this category the persons presenting the booth may not demonstrate any of the items nor may any of the observers take part in the display, it is merely an exhibition. You may explain and illustrate your display by posters, etc. The second category, Display activity, unlike the first category allows the people offering the booth to put on a demonstration, or instruction in which the observers can take part. Perhaps you may want to demonstrate feather-wrapping, Indian dancing, making plaster slides, etc. The third category, Activities, is for Chapters, groups, etc. to stage and run Indian games, stunts, etc. This too, should be for everyone to participate in. This will be conducted in the center of the parade grounds.

Chapters should consider and decide in what categories they wish to enter.

More detailed information concerning the County Fair, judging, ruling, etc. will be available at the Chapter Chief's meeting on Oct. 3, at Breyer Training Area at 2:00 P.M.

Also, on Saturday there will be competition in Ordeal and Brotherhood teams on a Chapter level. Saturday evening "Green - Bar Bill" will preview his new book, there will be Ordeal and Brotherhood ceremonies followed by a hootenany. On Sunday the eventful weekend will climax with a banquet at which time awards and patches will be presented. All Lodge insignia will be on sale.

RULES FOR JUDGING TEAMS

There will be seven judges, 3 men and 4 boys.

The following point scale will be used to judge teams:

Memorization of parts-	1 - 10 points
Inflection-	1 - 10 points
Position-	1 - 10 points
Appearance-	1 - 10 points

If the team is late they will be disqualified.

Costumes will be supplied by the Lodge.

Each Chapter may have as many different teams as they wish. But not more than what the script calls for.

No Arrowmen over twenty-one (21) may participate.

RULES FOR DANCE CONTEST

There will be four judges. There will be four classifications as follows: under six months individual, over six months individual, under six months team (two or more dancers), over six months team (two or more dancers). The six months refers to time in practice.

The following point scale will be used in the judging of dances:

Appearance (correct application of costumes)	1-10 points
Execution of dance	1-10 points
Narration or Explanation of dance	1-10 points

Arrowmen over twenty-one (21) are permitted to participate.

There is no limitation on the people involved.

You may present as many dances as you like as long as they are within the 10 minute limit.
