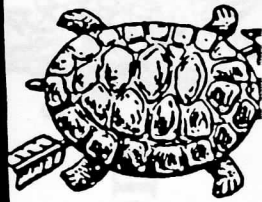

I, Mr. Bob Murset, am confident that with your whole-hearted support Unami will remain #1!.

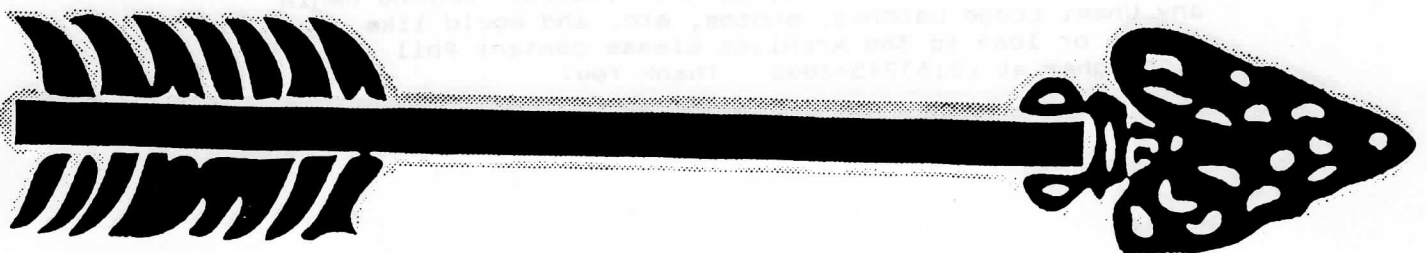


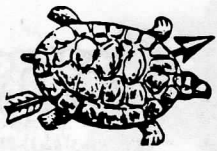

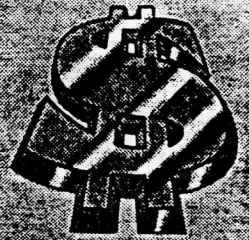
## CAMP PROMOTIONS

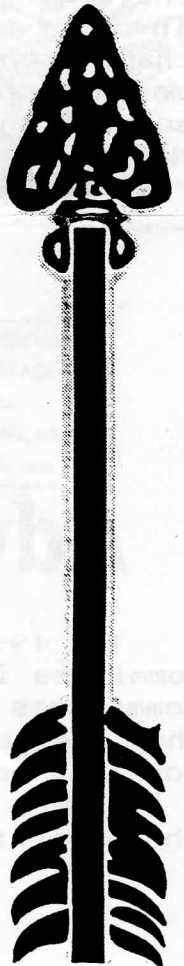
## ARCHIVES
