We have been going around to many troops with summer camp presentations, and it is running smoothly. I would like to thank Mike Coyne especially, for all of his work and time put into this project.

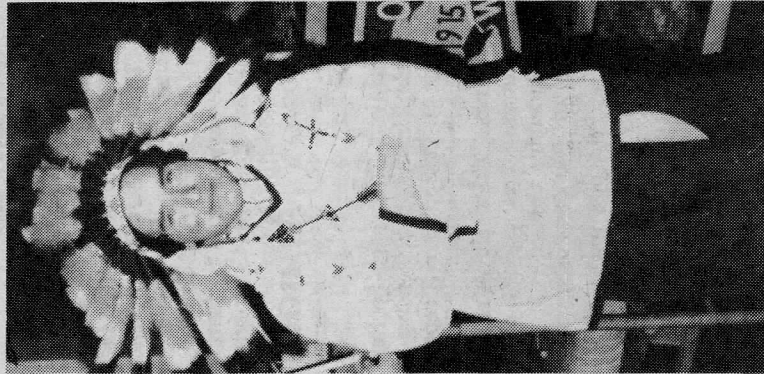

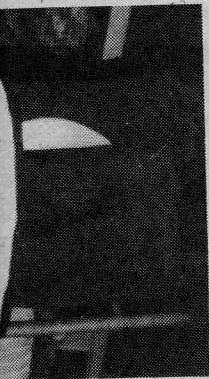
## Message From The Chief

Brothers of Unami,

The tasks that lie ahead for Unami Lodge are not to be taken lightly. We are currently in a situation which requires the undivided attention of everyone as a Brother in the Order of the Arrow. These tasks range from the promotion of both Hart Scout Reservation and Treasure Island to improving and increasing the membership and involvement of our brothers. What we currently see is a Lodge where too much needs to be accomplished, and too few are involved to bring about the results that an organization such as ours is and should be able to accomplish. As of January 30, 1982, the Lodge membership for the current year was at a count of nearly Brothers. By late summer, that figure will reach nearly 1500. However, it is a shame that the majority of these 1500 could be considered "card carrying members," and then that is the extent of their membership. As of January 30, the Executive Committee of the Lodge stood at close to 80 members, including Lodge Officers, Committee Chairmen, Vice-Chairmen, Chapter Officers, and Advisers. 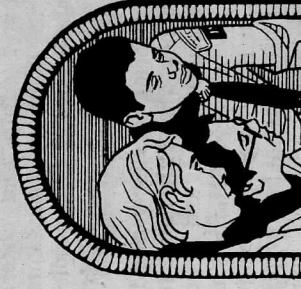
## Officers Training

### Wissahickon Valley

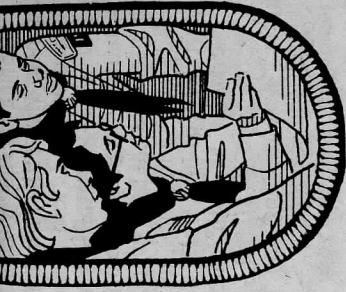

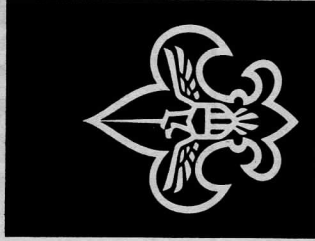
# CROSSED ARROWS
