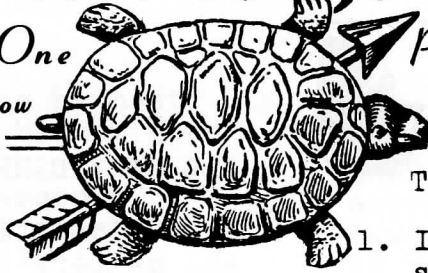

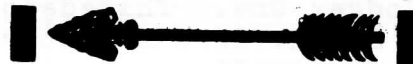
1. Be active in the Lodge for at least ten months.
