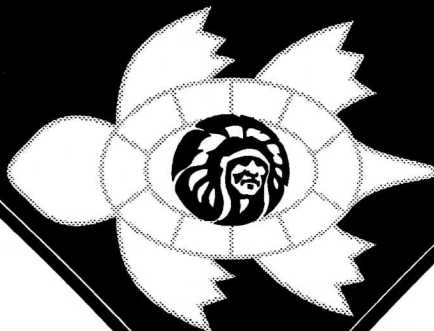

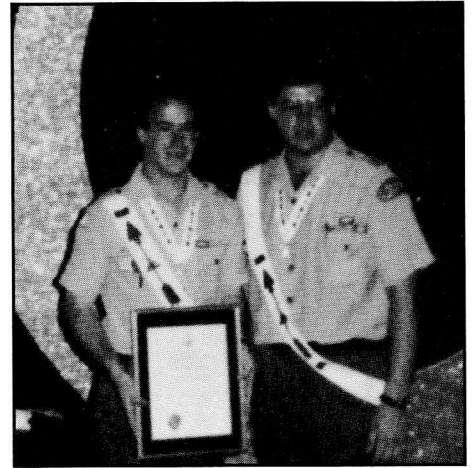
Past Lodge Chief receives national recognition

1986 Unami Lodge Chief Mark Chilutti was presented with the prestigious Distinguished Service Award at the National Order of the Arrow Conference in August.

The National Order of the Arrow Committee presents the DSA to those arrowmen who have rendered outstanding service on a sectional, area, regional or national basis. It is given primarily for dedicated service to the Order and Scouting over a period of years. Only a limited number of awards are presented at each Conference. Arrowmen whose service records are the most outstanding and extend the farthest beyond the local level are usually selected.

Mark has distinguished himself on a sectional level as Vice-Chief and Chief of Section NE-5A. On the national level, he has served as a member of the NOAC Training Committee support staff, manager of the Jamboree Radio Station WBSJ at the 1989 National Jamboree, manager of the National Conference Radio Station KWWW in 1988 and Conference Vice-Chief for Public Relations that same year. Mark served as an adviser to the Activities Committee at this year's NOAC which included supervising the Radio Station WWWW.

Service with a smile: Anniversary projects update

In early March, every member of the Lodge was sent a letter from Lodge Chief Dave King. This letter stated that the Lodge had adopted the financing and construction of Project COPE as a commemoration of Unami's 75th Anniversary. Shortly after this decision was made, an anonymous individual donated a large sum of money to Philadelphia Council and specifically requested that it be used to build Project COPE. Therefore, the Lodge had to seek an alternate project.

Instead of undertaking one large project, the Anniversary Committee chose to complete several projects of a smaller scale. The first of these projects, the replacement of the Treasure Island Ceremonial Ground benches, has already been completed. Due to the efforts of two service weekends and a crew from the Spring Service, the benches were able to be used at this year's NE-4B Conclave, summer camp and the Anniversary Weekend. Thanks to Vince Sokol who was instrumental in obtaining the lumber, Ken Nygard and Jerry Reed who gave guidance on the reconstruction work and Jeff Aster who coordinated the project from the Lodge end.

At the June 75th Anniversary Meeting, the committee decided to finance two other projects at our camps. The first was the purchase of fifty tents from I. Goldberg at a discounted rate. The tents were used at both Hart and T.I. this past summer. Each tent will be stenciled with

a mark signifying that it was donated by Unami. The other project was the financing of twelve mountain bikes and safety gear to be used in the Treasure Island camp program. Scouts rode the Murray bikes this summer on the Delaware Canal Towpath to either embark on canoe trips north of the island or take a leisurely ride.

All of the Lodge projects for 1990 are

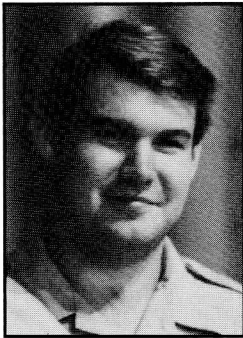
JOIN IN THE JUBILEE

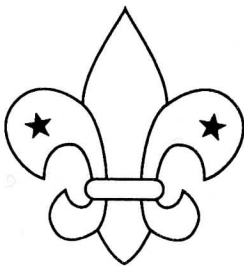
