

NISHA KITTAN LODGE #114
LEWIS AND CLARK COUNCIL



General History

The Lewis and Clark Council and the associated Nisha Kittan Lodge are the product of a long history of council mergers, some involving some confusing history and re-used names.

There were five different councils and associated OA lodges within the territory now covered by the council and lodge:

- A short-lived Marissa Council was present in 1916 and 1917, before dissolving. The successor council in that area was the Granite City Council (#128), founded in 1920. This council changed its name twice, to the Tri-City Council in 1922, and to the Cahokia Mound Council in 1925. Cahokia Lodge (126) was chartered to this council in 1938. Its totem was a chief's head.
- The Belleville Council (#114) was founded in 1917, with its headquarters in Belleville. This council also changed its name twice, to the Belleville Area Council in 1933, and to the Kaskaskia Council in 1936. The Ellini Lodge (115) was chartered to this council in 1938, but it changed its name to the Cascasquia Lodge (115) the following year. Its totem was a bird with an eye on its breast.
- The East St. Louis Council (#122) was founded in 1919. It changed its name to the Mississippi Valley Council in 1935. That same year, Mannaseh Lodge (81) was chartered to the newly-renamed council. Its totem was the buffalo.
- The Alton Council was founded in 1920 and also changed its name twice, to the Alton-Wood River Council in 1922 and to the Piasa Bird Council in 1930. Blackhawk Lodge (94) was chartered to this council in 1936. Its totem was Chief Blackhawk, a Nineteenth century chief of a faction of Sauk, Fox, Kickapoo, and Ho-Chunk (Winnebago) peoples, who fought against the United States in the Black Hawk War of 1832.
- The Jefferson & Marion Council (#685), headquartered in Centralia was founded in 1924. It divided into two councils in 1928, the National Trails Council (#139) of Vandalia, which lasted from 1927 to 1931 before disbanding, and the remaining portion becoming the Ambraw - Wabash Council (#116), based in Decatur. In 1939, Woapink Lodge (167) was chartered to this council. The council changed its name in 1933 to the Buffalo Trace Council (#116), headquartered in Mt. Vernon, Illinois. Both the Buffalo Trace Council and Woapink Lodge (167) names would be re-used later, although there is little to no connection between the different entities with the same names.

There were a total of four different mergers and/or dissolutions that ultimately merged these five councils into one.

- 1955
 - The Buffalo Trace Council (#116) dissolved due to financial difficulties. The territory occupied by this former council was split up, into the Kaskaskia Council (#114), the Lincoln Trails Council (#121), and the Wabash Valley Council (#166). A small portion of the Buffalo Trace Council also merged into Southern Indiana Area Council in 1931, which then changed its name to the Buffalo Trace Council in 1956. Members of the former Woapink Lodge became members of the Cascasquia Lodge (115), Kaskaskia Council, the Kickapoo Lodge (128), Wabash Valley Council and some merged with Acorn Lodge (422) to form Kiondaga Lodge (422), in the renamed Buffalo Trace Council. OA members in the new territory of the Lincoln Trails Council had no lodge to go to, but two years later, this council chartered a lodge, re-using both the Woapink Lodge name and the lodge number, 167.
- 1965
 - The Mississippi Valley Council and the Kaskaskia Council merged to form the Okaw Valley Council (#116), headquartered in Belleville. The following year, Mannaseh Lodge (81) and

Cascasquia Lodge (115) merged to form Taleka Lodge (81). At this time, when mergers occurred, new lodges generally adopted the lower number of the two merging lodges, hence the Lodge 81 number. The new lodge totem was the white egret.

- 1991
 - The Cahokia Mound Council and the Piasa Bird Council merged to form the Trails West Council (#112), headquartered in Wood River. That same year, Cahokia Lodge (126) and Blackhawk Lodge (94) merged to form Kishkakon Lodge (32). By this time, in many mergers, the new lodge adopted the lowest number available, which was 32, a number previously used by Kitchawonk Lodge (32), which changed its name to Tahawus Lodge (32), which “gave up” that number when it merged with Appachedotte Lodge (246) to form Horicon Lodge (246). The totem of the new lodge was the eagle.
- 2009
 - The Okaw Valley Council and the Trails West Council merged to form the Lewis and Clark Council (#114). This re-used a council name used between 1928 and 1992 by a council based in Lewiston, Idaho. Lewis and Clark was chosen because the Lewis and Clark expedition started across the river from the council in St. Louis, Missouri in 1804. Taleka Lodge (81) and Kishkakon Lodge (32) merged to form Nisha Kittan Lodge (114) in 2009. Since the National OA had stopped issuing official lodge numbers in the early 1970s, lodges were somewhat free to adopt their own numbers, and by 2009, many new, merged lodges either used no lodge number, or adopted the number of their council, if it was available. Nisha Kittan chose to adopt 114, the number associated with their council.

When the Trails West and Okaw Valley Councils started consolidation, so did Kishkakon and Taleka Lodges. Seven youth and advisers from both Lodges met and put the framework together for Nisha Kittan.

Over the next several months, the youth had selected a Lodge name and totem. They continued to work on the Lodge by Laws and other issues. By summer camp of 2009, the consolidation committee had completed their work. They passed the instructions to the two former lodges. That first year, there were two officers elected to each lodge position. The Lodge was born on October 1st, 2009.

The Legend of Nisha Kittan

The region was once inhabited by many tribes. These tribes and the people lived in harmony with each other and the world around them. Bison, deer, fish and crops were in abundance. The people did not have to want for anything. They lived many moons in this land of harmony.

But times were changing. Travelers to this land tell tales of dark clouds on the horizon and suffering. These tales concern the Chiefs of Taleka and Kishkakon. The Mighty Chiefs agree to council and gather at the land between the rivers.

During the time of council, the Chiefs were visited by a lone black wolf. The black wolf approached the council fire and the chiefs. He then told of his travels to this great land. He tells the Chiefs that he has seen the dark spirit on the horizon. He said times are bad, food is in short supply, people suffer, and the sky is dark. He tells many tales of suffering and many lives lost. The Chiefs ask if they can defeat the

darkness. Black wolf tells them that the spirit of brotherhood will always defeat the dark and evil spirits. The chiefs ask black wolf to stay the night in the lodge. The Chiefs ask the Great Spirit for guidance throughout that dark night.

The next morning the skies were darker than the days before. This concerned the Chiefs. Black wolf appeared from the lodge and said that he must go forth and tell his story to others. The Chiefs again ask if they can defeat the darkness. He reminds them that they have the answer that will provide the peace they seek. The black wolf turns away and starts walking to the west.

The Chiefs call to the black wolf. They run to him and ask his name. He said that his name is not important, it is the message. Before the wolf departs, he said the people of Taleka and Kishkakon were as mighty as the great waters of this meeting place. The two Chiefs reaffirmed their dedication to each other and the spirit of brotherhood.

The Chiefs went forth and combined the two Tribes into one great Nation. They chose a name inspired by the wise black wolf, Nisha Kittan, Two Great River Lodge. The storms came, but the people of Nisha Kittan survived and continue to flourish in the spirit of brotherhood.

Centurions

The Centurion Award aims to highlight “Arrowmen” who have meaningfully contributed to the forming, maturing and ongoing operational excellence of their local council’s lodge, and who, in doing so, inspired others to follow in their footsteps over the past 100 years.

Kishkakon Lodge

Kishkakon Lodge 32 was created as a result of the consolidation of the Cahokia Mounds Council and the Piasa Bird Council and their respective OA Lodges. The process of consolidation started in 1990 and was completed in 1991.

The first year of Kishkakon Lodge saw the last elected officers from Blackhawk Lodge and Cahokia Lodges being Co-Officers. In 1992, the first officers that were only Kishkakon were elected.

Kishkakon (Those who make trails) Lodge returned the Rocky Fork hiking trail around Camp Warren Levis back to a servicable condition. The lodge produced many outstanding arrowmen who many section offices throughout the years.

The current ECO-Cabin at Camp Warren Levis was purchased by the lodge through the sale of a special "night" Lodge Flap.

Kishkakon Lodge supported both council camps through the purchase of materials and through the hundreds of service hours given in support of the camps.

Cahokia Lodge

Cahokia Lodge 126 was chartered July 30, 1938. Merged with Blackhawk 94 in 1991 to form Kishkakon Lodge 32.

Lodge Totem: Thunderbird / Cahokia Indian

Cahokia Lodge was named after Cahokia Mound which is located in Collinsville, Illinois.

Event Timeline

July 1939: The five-week camping season came to a close at Camp Rankin near Ironton, Missouri. Six members of the Lodge were awarded the Brotherhood (Second Degree) honor. Those receiving Brotherhood were Harold Lee (Edwardsville), Edward Lueders (Granite City), Charles Molden (Troy), Carroll Spindler (Edwardsville), Don Wildon (Edwardsville), and Cahokia Mound Council Scout Commissioner Jasper B. Johnson (Edwardsville). New Ordeal (First Degree) honorees were John MacDonald (Edwardsville), William Davis (Edwardsville), Wayne Cox (Edwardsville), Bob McCormick (Collinsville), Gene Schott (Highland), Robert Bucheim (Highland), James Houseman (Highland), James Baumann (Highland), Chester Harris (Edwardsville), Byron Beswick (Mitchell), Gerald Broadway (Granite City), John Pistrul (Granite City), and Harold Langford (Edwardsville) Leslie Jagers (Edwardsville). Honorary memberships were awarded to Cahokia Mound Council President Milton R. Allen and past President and current Council Executive Board member Ed Johnson.

Dec 1939: The Lodge held the annual meeting at Camp Graham. Motions were approved for the promotion of camping at Camp Rankin and the construction of a Council Ring at Camp Graham. An election of officers for 1940 was held. Ed Leuders (Granite City) was elected president to succeed Harold Lee (Edwardsville). Bob Bitzer (Collinsville) was selected as vice-president, Wayne Cox (Edwardsville) as Secretary, and James Houseman (Highland) as treasurer.

June to July 1944: Summer camp was held at Camp Graham. Swimming instruction took place at the YMCA in Granite City while boating and canoeing was at McDonald Lake.

1948: Cahokia Mound Council utilized Camp Illinek on Lake Springfield for the summer camp program.

February 1950: Danny Eilers was elected Chief during the Annual Meeting held at St. John's Evangelical Church in Nameoki. Paul Morris was elected Vice Chief, Don Schuette was elected treasurer, and Frank Accardi as Scribe.

1951: The Cahokia Mound Council summer camp program and Lodge activities were conducted at Camp Joy.

September 1955: The seventh annual Cahokia Mounds Council Camporee was held at Sportsman's Park in Edwardsville with over 500 scouts in attendance. Lodge Chief Walter Schramm held a "Tapping out" ceremony, during which 16 scouts were selected as candidates.

Fall 1955: Walter Schramm was elected 7-F Section Chief at the Section Conclave held at Allerton Park in Monticello.

May 1957: The Lodge "Indian" dance group, known as the Sun Dancers, participated in the evening program at the Edwardsville District Camporee.

January 1959: Earl Lee, Principle of Nameoki School and a council scouter was the guest speaker at the Winter Banquet. The banquet was held at the Granite City YMCA. The Lodge activities report noted that the Lodge purchased four tee pees for use at Camp Sunnen and that over 100 new arrowmen had been inducted in 1958. It was noted that in 1959 the Cahokia Mound Council would for the first time be offering Explorer Base program features. Council Commissioner Rollin Henn presented Vigil Honor certificates to the 1958 class and the 1959 Lodge Officers were installed.

December 1968: Dick Schofield of the St. Louis Baseball Cardinals was the guest speaker at the Winter Banquet. The banquet was held at Trinity Lutheran School in Edwardsville. New Lodge Officers were installed and Henry Hellrich of Granite City was presented with the 1968 Meritorious Award. Jim Anderson (Granite City) was installed as Lodge Chief, Mike Durbin (Highland) Lira Evans (Granite City), Mike Tognarelli (Collinsville) were to serve as officers. Outgoing Chief was Linus Hellrich, and his officers; Jim Hellrich, Dan Lando, and Richard Good(?)

March 25, 1973: The Lodge hosted an "all-you-can-eat" pancake meal at St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church cafeteria in Granite City. The event was held to raise funds for a new campsite at Camp Sunnen.

1978: The entire staff for the Camp Sunnen summer camp program were arrowmen.

January 13, 1979: The Lodge sponsored the Winter Event which was held at SIU-E at the Point on Tower Lake. The theme of the event was Klondike Derby. Dan Tolliver served as the event Chairman.

January 1979: The Annual Dinner had an attendance of 104. During the meeting it was decided to raise Lodge dues from \$2.00 to \$2.50 effective January 1980.

February 1979: Pancake breakfast plans were being made by each of the three chapters.

Fall 1989: David Heimann elected NC-5 Section Secretary.

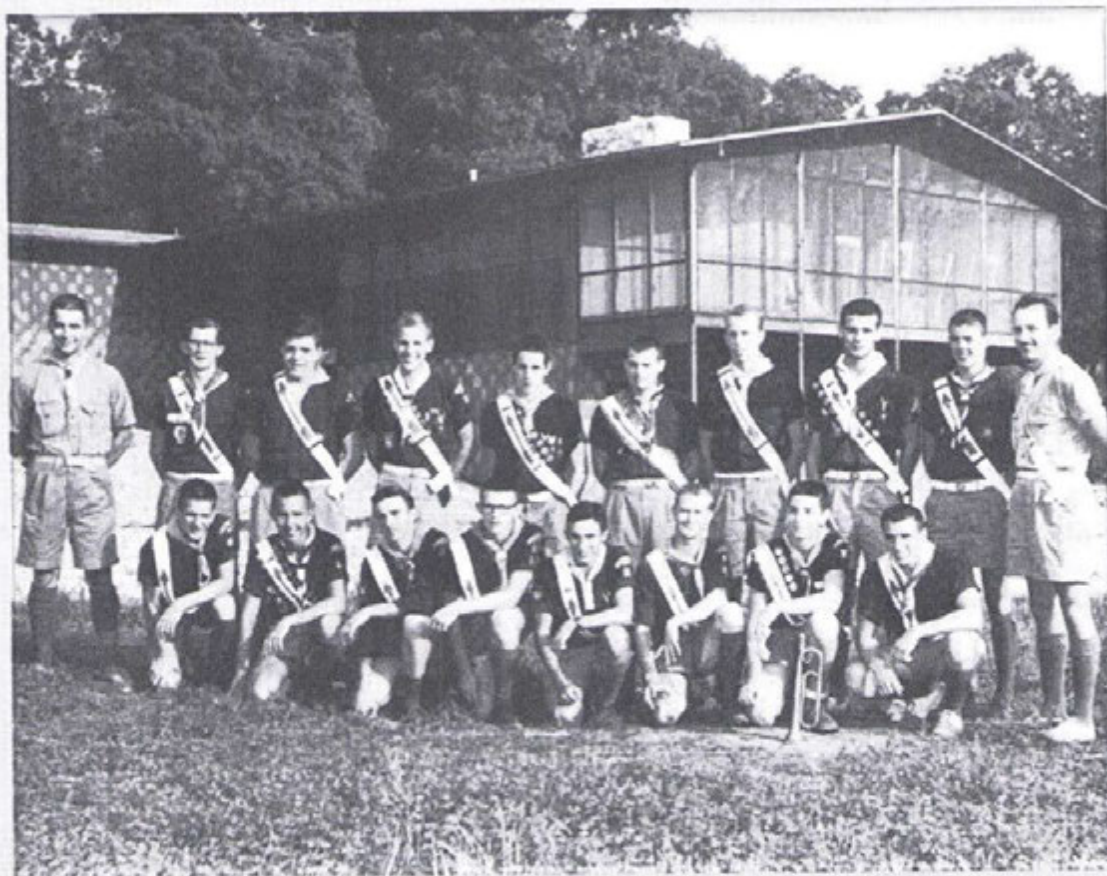

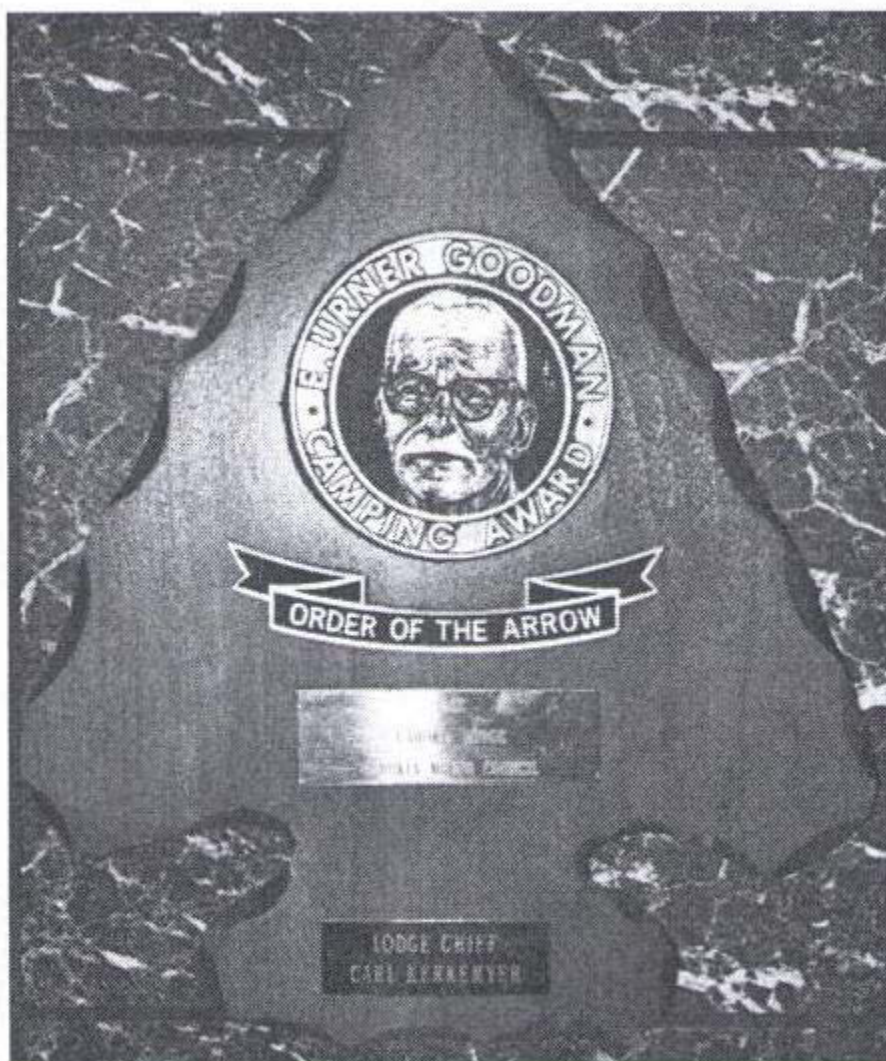

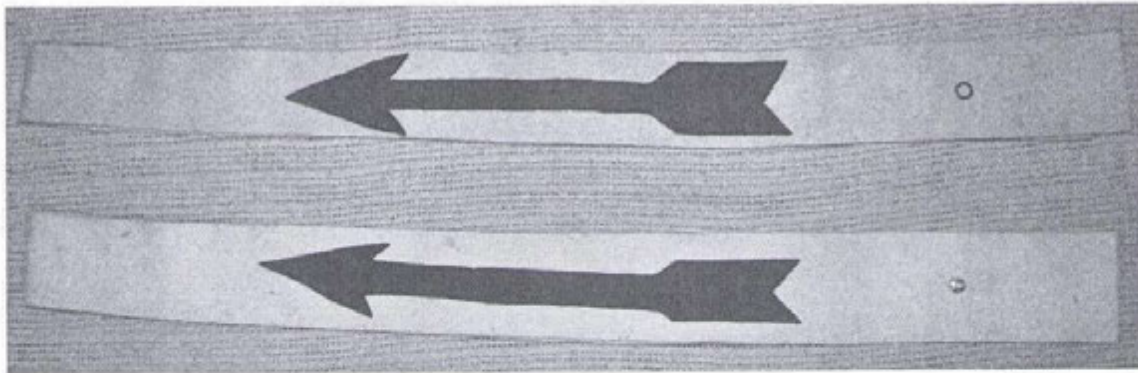

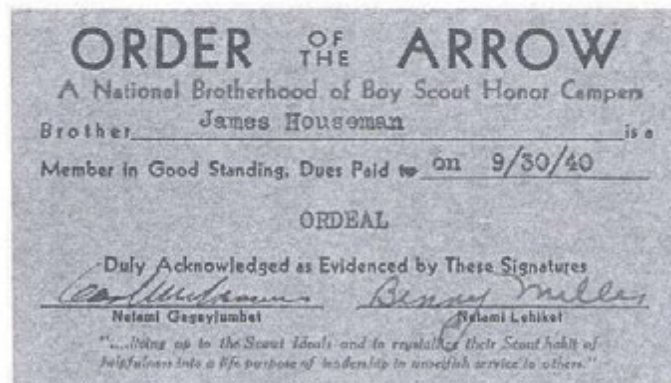

CAHOKIA LODGE RULES

* These rules may not be changed by the local lodge

I. Name and affiliation of lodge

- A. The name of this lodge of the Order of the Arrow shall be the Cahokia Lodge #126 W.W.W.
- * B. The lodge shall be affiliated with Cahokia Mound Council, Boy Scouts of America, and shall be under the supervision of the Council Camping Committee and the administrative authority of the Scout Executive.
- C. The totem shall be that of the Cahokia Indian; the war cry of the Cahokia Indians shall be the call.
- D. The standard set of colors for lodge neckerchiefs shall be gold and red.
 - 1. Each member shall receive only one official lodge neckerchief and one lodge patch upon induction and may purchase one per year, that is not to be traded or resold.
 - 2. Lodge neckerchiefs and sashes shall be worn only at Order of the Arrow functions.
- E. This lodge shall be divided into three chapters. Each chapter shall come under the supervision of the related district camping committee and the District Scout Executive.

II. Election to membership

- * A. The requirements for membership in this lodge are as required in the Order of the Arrow Handbook.
- * B. Procedure for the Ordeal shall be as stated in the Order of the Arrow Handbook.
- C. All elections must clear through the unit elections committee.

III. Officers

- * A. The officers of this lodge shall be lodge chief, lodge vice chief, lodge secretary, and lodge treasurer. These elected officers must be under twenty-one years of age for their entire term of office.
- B. The officers of each chapter of this lodge shall be chapter chief, vice-chief, and secretary. These elected officers must be under twenty-one years of age for their entire term of office and must reside within the Council boundary.
- C. Lodge officers shall be elected at the Fall Conclave. The term of all officers, chapter and lodge, shall be from Fall Conclave to Fall Conclave, and they shall be installed at the Fall Conclave.

Cahokia Lodge Rules (Cont.)

- * D. The executive committee shall be composed of the four elected lodge officers; the immediate past lodge chief; the lodge operating committee chairman; the lodge advisor; a member of the camping committee; the chapter chief and the advisor to each chapter; the Scout Executive and the staff advisor.
- * E. The lodge advisor and chapter advisors shall be appointed by the Scout Executive in consultation with the related camping committee chairmen.
- F. The lodge chief shall appoint such operating committees as may be required from time to time with the approval of the lodge executive committee; all chairmen shall be under twenty-one years of age.
- G. The chapter chief shall appoint such operating committees as may be required from time to time with the approval of the chapter executive committee; all chairmen shall be under twenty-one years of age.

IV. Lodge meetings

- A. The lodge shall schedule at least the events listed below:
 - 1. Spring Conclave
 - 2. Fall Conclave
 - 3. Annual December Meeting
 - 4. Summer Fellowship Week-end
- B. The executive committee of this lodge shall hold at least four meetings a year.
- C. Special meetings of the executive committee or of the lodge may be called by the lodge chief with the approval of the Scout Executive or by the Scout Executive.
- D. Each meeting of the lodge shall be opened with the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
- * E. Members of the Order twenty-one years of age or over shall have no vote in any decisions of the lodge.

V. Dues

- A. There shall be an induction fee payable at the time of induction. For such, each new Ordeal member shall receive:
 - 1. A Cahokia Lodge Pocket Flap Patch
 - 2. A Membership card
 - 3. An Order of the Arrow sash
 - 4. An Order of the Arrow Handbook
 - 5. Dues paid until December 31, year of induction.
 - 6. An Order of the Arrow Ribbon Pin

Cahokia Lodge Rules (Cont.)

- B. Dues of the lodge shall be collected annually by the chapter treasurer in the amount of \$2.50, effective December 31, 1979, to be given to the lodge treasurer immediately for deposit with the Council office. Dues must be paid by December 31.
- C. In the development of the lodge annual budget, funds will be made available for chapter mailings, activities, and service projects. Chapters must gain approval from the lodge treasurer and Advisor before incurring expenses. All approved bills will be paid by the Council office.
- * D. All Order of the Arrow funds shall be handled through the Council office and go through all normal accounting procedures used by the Council.
- E. Inactive members may be restored to active status by paying back dues for one year and the current dues.

VI. Brotherhood membership

- * A. Completion of Brotherhood membership shall be in accordance with the Order of the Arrow Handbook.

* VII. The Vigil Honor

- A. Attainment of the Vigil Honor shall be in accordance with the Order of the Arrow Handbook.

VIII. Amendments to rules

- A. These rules shall be subject to amendment at any regular or special meeting of this lodge provided such amendment has been submitted in writing to the executive committee at least one month prior to such meeting and that due notice has been sent to all active members at least ten days prior to such meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members present shall be required, and there must be a quorum of $\frac{2}{3}$ of all voting members present.

CAHOKIA LODGE RULES

I. NAME AND AFFILIATION OF LODGE

- A. The name of this Lodge of the Order of the Arrow shall be the Cahokia Lodge #126, W.W.W.
- B. The Lodge shall be affiliated with Cahokia Mound Council, Boy Scouts of America, and shall be under the supervision of the Council Camping Committee and the administrative authority of the Scout Executive.
- C. The totem shall be that of the Cahokia Indian; the war cry of the Cahokia Indian shall be the call.
- D. This Lodge shall be divided into three Chapters. Each chapter shall come under the supervision of the related district camping committee and the District Scout Executive.

II. ELECTION TO MEMBERSHIP

- *A. The requirements for membership in this lodge are as required in the Order of the Arrow Handbook.
- *B. Procedure for the Ordeal shall be as stated in the Order of the Arrow Handbook.
- C. All elections must be approved by the unit elections committee.

III. OFFICERS

- A. The officers of this Lodge shall be; Lodge Chief, Lodge 1st Vice-Chief, [In charge of Ceremonies], 2nd Lodge Vice-Chief, [In charge of Camp Promotion and Elections], Lodge Secretary and Lodge Treasurer. Other Vice Chiefs may be elected, as the lodge executive board, deems necessary. All officers and operating chairpersons must be under 21 years of age for the entire term of office.
- B. The Officers of each Chapter of this Lodge shall be; Chapter Chief, Chapter Vice Chief and Chapter Secretary. These elected officers must be under twenty-one years of age for the entire term of office and must reside within the Chapter boundry. [Chapter boundary being the same as the District boundry.]
- C. All officers, both lodge and chapter, shall be elected at the fall conclave. Their term of office shall be for one year and shall commence at the winter banquet.
- D. The executive committee shall be composed of the elected lodge

officers, the three chapter chiefs, the lodge operating committee chairpersons, the immediate past lodge chief, the lodge adviser, the chapter advisers, a member of the camping committee, the scout executive and if necessary, a staff adviser.

- E. The lodge adviser and the chapter advisers and if necessary a staff adviser, shall be appointed annually by the Scout Executive in consultation with the related camping committee.
- F. The Lodge Chief and the Chapter Chiefs shall appoint operating committees as may be required with the approval of the Lodge executive committee, all chairmen shall be under 21 years of age for the entire term of the committee.
- G. Any Lodge, Chapter officer, or committee chairman may be removed from office for a cause. Grounds for removal shall be any of the following:
 - 1. Failure to maintain active status.
 - 2. Consistent and repeated failure to perform the duties of office, as specified in the O A Handbook.
 - 3. Non conformation to B.S.A., O.A. or Cahokia Lodge policy.
 - 4. The procedure for removing an executive board member from office shall be:
 - a. A written petition, stating a reason and/or reasons the officer should be removed from office, signed by at least ten [10] active youth members, submitted to the executive prior to a regular meeting.
 - b. The executive board shall vote on the petition. At least 2/3 of the youth lodge executive board members must be present before a vote can be taken and a 3/4 vote of the youth present is needed to remove the executive board youth member.
 - 5. Vacancies shall be filled in the following way and/or ways:
 - a. If the Lodge Chief or one of the Lodge Vice-chiefs is removed, the vacancy is to be filled by succession.
 - b. If the Lodge Secretary or Lodge Treasurer is removed, the Lodge Chief will appoint someone to fill the vacancy, with the approval of the executive board.
 - c. If a vacancy occurs in the chapter they shall be filled in the following way or ways; Chapter chief will be filled by appointment from the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the executive board.
 - d. If a vacancy occurs in the chapter vice-chief or chapter secretary, the Chapter Chief shall appoint a youth to the position, with the approval of the executive board.

IV. LODGE MEETINGS

- A. The Lodge shall schedule and hold, at least, the events listed;
 - 1. Winter event, at the Councils option.
 - 2. Spring Conclave.
 - 3. Summer Conclave.
 - 4. Fall Conclave.
 - 5. Lodge Officers Training.
 - 6. Winter Banquet.

- B. The executive Committee of this Lodge shall hold at least four meetings a year.
- C. Special meetings of the executive committee or of the lodge may be called by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Scout Executive or by the Scout Executive.
- D. Each meeting of the Lodge shall be opened with the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
- E. Members of the Order, 21 years of age or over shall have no vote in any decisions of the lodge.

V. Dues

- A. There shall be an induction fee, payable at the time of induction. For such fee, each Ordeal member shall receive; 1. A Cahokia Lodge Flap Patch, 2. A membership card, 3. An Order of the sash, 4. An Order of the Arrow Handbook and 5. Dues paid until December 31st of the year of induction.
- B. Dues of the Lodge shall be \$3.00 per year and paid by December 31st, each year. Dues shall be paid to the Council Service Center, by mail or in person. Arrowmen not paying dues before December 31st, will be dropped from the active status.
- C. In the development of the lodge annual budget, funds will be made available for chapter mailings, activities and service projects. Chapters must gain approval from the lodge treasurer and adviser before incurring expenses. All approved bills will be paid by the Council Service Center.
- D. All Order of the Arrow funds shall be handled through the council Service Center and go through all normal accounting procedures used by the Council.
- E. Inactive members may be restored to active status by paying current dues and by paying a five dollar [\$5.00] reinstatement fee.
- F. A 10 year dues card may be purchased by paying 7 times the current dues rate.

VI. Completion of Brotherhood membership shall be in accordance with the Order of the Arrow Handbook.

- VII. A. Attainment of the Vigil Honor shall be in accordance with the Order of the Arrow Handbook.
- B. Nominations for Vigil Honor may be submitted, in writing by any active member, to the Lodge Chief, no latter than the Summer Conclave.
 - C. The Vigil selection committee shall be appointed by the Lodge

Chief, with the approval of the Scout Executive and should consist of youth and an adult adviser all of whom has received the Vigil Honor.

D. The Vigil Ceremony shall be preformed at the Fall Conclave.

VIII. AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES

These lodge rules may be amended by submitting, in writing, to the executive committee, the proposed rule or rules to be changed. These rule or rules changes must be in the hands of the executive committee prior to an executive board meeting. If the executive committee approves, notice shall be sent to all lodge members at least fifteen days prior to the next meeting of the membership. A 2/3 vote from all youth members present is required to accept the amendment change.

Amendments are put into effect immediatly, unless other wise stated.

IX. Founders Award

- A. Nominations for the Founders Award maybe submitted, in writing, by any active member, to the Lodge Chief at the Fall Conclave.
- B. The Founders Award selection committee shall be appointed by the Lodge Chief, with the approval of the Scout Executive and should consist of youth members and at least one adult, all of whom has received the Founders Award.
- C. The founders Award shall be awarded at the Winter Banquet.

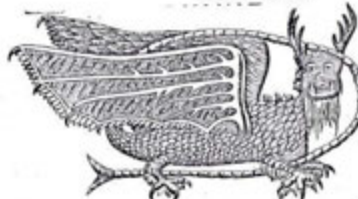

50th Anniversary Award . . . Verle Kins

Mr. Kins outlined the requirements for the 50th Anniversary award and urged all members to participate in this program. He furnished score cards for the new members.

Adoption of Enabling Resolution: . . . Glen Ogilvie

James Bollmeier, Cascasquia Lodge Chief, stated that the primary purpose of the combined meeting was to consolidate the two lodges now operating within the Okaw Valley Council into one organization. He asked Glen Ogilvie to read the enabling resolution as follows:

Be It Resolved, that the membership of the Cascasquia Lodge and the Mannasseh Lodge, meeting in joint session, form a single lodge within the confines of the Okaw Valley Council, B.S.A., and herewith agree to:

The Great Spirit, in his infinite wisdom, populated the earth with birds and beasts, created

with a native wisdom. Among them he situated our red brothers, endowed with the ability to think. The Red Man grew in wisdom and multiplied and formed tribes. These tribes learned to live in the world by passing along tribal lore from father to son, from generation to generation.

One great chieftan used as his totem, Taleka, the Great White Egret. To each young brave he imparted the ways of Taleka. To each, the Chief would point out the Great White Egret, standing at the water's edge -- the stately one, the observant one. He sees in all directions -- on the land, over the lakes, and below the clear blue waters.

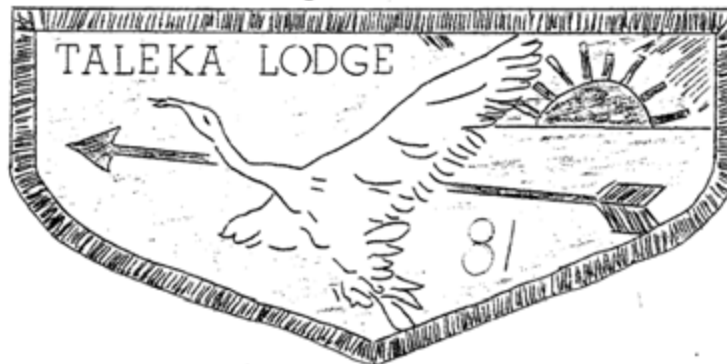

Scouting came to our area in 1919 with the East St. Louis Area Council receiving a charter from National and assigned #122.

In 1920, the Belleville Area Council was formed and assigned #116.

Each council operated as neighbors yet were distinct. In 1935, East St. Louis Area Council became Mississippi Valley Council and in 1936 Belleville Area became Kaskaskia Council. A few years prior to this, 1934 to be exact, the National Council, BSA, on June 2 approved the order of the arrow and local councils were permitted to integrate it as they saw fit, although the OA was not completely integrated as part of the National BSA Program until May of 1948.

Always progressive and ready to add new programs for its boys, especially camping-~~type~~⁴⁰⁶ programs, Mississippi Valley Council created the Mannaseh Lodge on July 23, 1935 and Kaskaskia Council created the Cascasquia Lodge on August 1, 1938.

In 1965, Mississippi Valley and Kaskaskia Councils merged to form Okaw Valley Council. The OA Lodge merged as well and created Taleka Lodge #81.

The Indian's name for the lodge is Lenape and it's animal is the Great White Egret of Indian Legend. The lodge has issue six flaps and one neckerchief, various conclave and fellowship patches, as well as a belt buckle, neckerchief slide and bolo tie. The lodge publishes the Egret - its own newsletter.

Today, 1990, Taleka Lodge is 25 years old and the current membership is commemorating the event with a special anniversary flap, the seventh one to be issued to date.

Cascasquia Lodge

In 1920, the Belleville Area Council was formed and assigned council number 116. In 1936, the council changed their name to the Kaskaskia Council. The OA was introduced to the council on August 1, 1938 when the Cascasquia Lodge was formed.

Cascasquia Lodge took #115 as their lodge number. Cascasquia was part of the Fox Tribe. The name is a derivative of a local tribe called Kaskaskia. The meaning of the name is interpreted as "He who scrapes it off by means of a tool. The totem was originally designated as a Copperhead Snake but was later changed to a Thunderbird.
