Reservations Now Open

SEVERAL new developments are in line for this years Biddle Encampment. The camp opens this year for the sixth season and will continue from July 25th to August 2nd inclusive. It is anticipated that it will be a bigger and better camp than ever before, for already the Scouts are talking about it and many Troops have already signified their intention of going and each with a large anticipated attendance.

Mr. Laurence Danforth, Assistant Scout Executive of the Philadelphia Council,

will direct the camp this year. Many of last years staff are already scheduled to be with us again this year—you fellows who were in camp last year remember them all, and know quite well the good times in store for all. An unusually full program is planned with heaps of new surprises and camp activities.

The camp will again supply all dishes and eating utensils for every Scout. Each Scout should supply himself with two (2) blankets (heavy), clothing and

personal equipment such as towels, soap, toothbrush and paste. Also bring some wet weather clothing, Scout Manual, axe, and knife are desirable, but not necessary.

The board rate will be \$5.50 per boy for the period. However, if more than ten boys from any one Troop

attend the cost will be only \$5 per boy in that Troop. A registration fee of \$1.00 per boy should be sent to Scout Headquarters for each boy attending, as soon as possible.

The camp is situated on the Darby Creek



near Broomall, Pa. Directions to the camp may be had at Headquarters.

Board rate—\$5.50 Individual; \$5.00 per boy is in group of ten.

Reservation—\$1.00 per boy—now open.
