Charter member of Troop 2, Herkimer, Dec. 13, 1920.

Resigned Dec. 31, 1954 after 34 years of Service as Ass't. Scoutmaster, Scoutmaster, District Commissioner of the Central District serving 11 troops for 5 years, was a Troop Committeeman, and served as a Council Member at Large for 8 years.

Served on Committees for: Aluminum Drive for the World War II war effort, Blood Donor Drives, Clothing Drive for Europe (1951), Conducted Training Courses, Conducted Field Days, Conducted County Mobilizations, Conducted Training Hikes, Conducted Thanksgiving Rallies, Conducted District Rallies, County Courts of Honor, General Herkimer Homestead Pilgrimages, Get Out the Vote Drive (1952), In charge of Gov't. Days in Herkimer, In charge of N.R.A. Drive (1933), "Mobilization" for Defence, Help set up the Order of Arrow, Oriskany Pilgrimages, Planning for: Camp Russell, Camporees, Camporees at Cedar Lake, and Expositions at the Mohawk Armory, "Rubber" Drive in Herkimer, The Sir William Johnson Bicentennial Celebration, Theatre Days in Herkimer, Toy Repairs for Christmas Distribution for the Salvation Army, Tree Planting with the New York State Conservation Dep't. and also attended the National Jamboree, Washington, D. C. where I served on the Health and Sanitation Regional II Staff. June 30, 1937.

Camp Russell:

Attended Camp Russell as a Scout in 1923 under William Flood, Scout Executive of Utica Council as Camp Director.

Served voluntarily in a leadership capacity in 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1934, 1936, 1938, 1940, 1941, 1946, 1947, 1948, 1949, 1950, 1951, and 1952 for a total of 16 years.

Was a Charter Member of the Camp Russell Staff Association, Jan. 3, 1986, resigning in 1991.

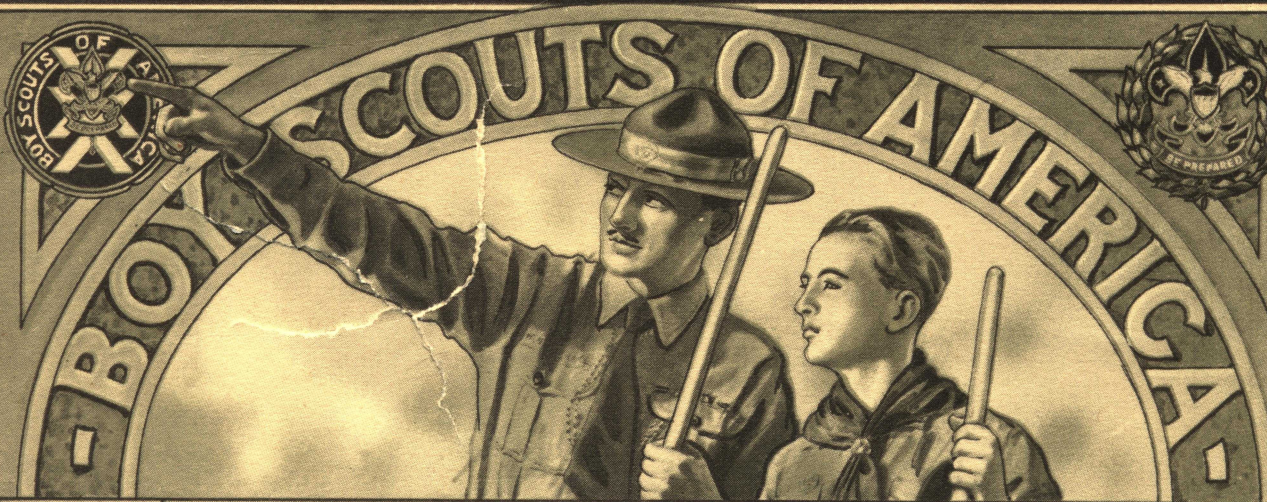

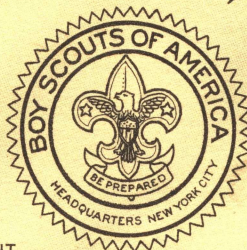
