Just inside the Wyoming state line and just out of Driggs, Idaho, there sits a most picturesque pine tree valley. The heart of this valley is the Teton Peaks Treasure Mountain Scout Camp. Originally named "Camp of the Tetons".

The patches and other memorabilia associated with this camp will be labeled TM-1 (Treasure Mountain-1), TM-2 (Treasure Mountain-2), etc. The Table Rock medals will be labeled TR-1, etc.

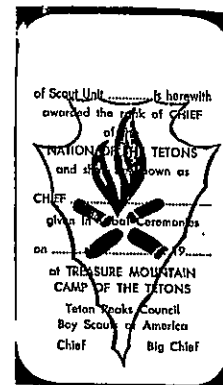
INDIAN LORE PROGRAM

Treasure Mountain Scout Camp wouldn't have its rich heritage if it wasn't for Vernon Strong and his "Indian Lore Program". An advancement type society of great campers. It is my opinion that this was Vernon's own version of a pre-Order of the Arrow program.

The four levels were as follows, with the designated award:

- 1 - Papoose - entry-level, no insignia.
- 2 - Brave - completed first year requirements,
red arrow on arrowhead.
- 3 - Warrior - completed second year
requirements, crossed tomahawks on
arrowhead.
- 4 - Chief - completed third year
requirements, campfire on arrowhead.
Also, Chiefs were given a new chief
name.

NOTE: A special honor of Fox Clan was
occasionally given to outstanding Chiefs.

Variations Galore

I have 9 variations of this series of patches. Most require color photos to identify. Shown are only those easily identified. The others are briefly described. TM-2A through TM-2 designed by Vernon Strong.

TM-2A: The first Treasure Mountain patch is easy to identify in color (sorry). Its' border, "Camp of the Tetons and Canoe" are bright gold/orange. The mountains are a dark, rich copper/rust color.

TM-2B: Rounded peak, cream/brown mountains, gold border and letters, 7 1/2mm canoe.

TM-2C: Pointed peak, dull tan/brown mountains, 7 1/2mm canoe.

TM-2D: Darker gray/brown mountains, also gold border and works, long 9mm canoe. (Gift from the Vernon Strong family)

TM-2E: Flesh/brown mountains, 8mm canoe. Third peak is sharply pointed; a strong blue border line between lake and trees.

TM-2F: Darker flesh/brown mountains, third peak is rounded, 8mm canoe, border and words bright yellow.

TM-2G: Copper brown mountains with a faint pink hue, 7mm canoe.

TM-2H: Medium brown mountains, dark green trees, fat wide lettering, 8mm canoe.

TM-2I: Gray/tan mountains, bright gold border and words, 7 1/2mm canoe.

CAMP RAMS HEAD

The scouts in the Arco, Idaho area around the mid and late 50's camped in an area of bureau of Land Management Land North West of Arco against the mountains. After a couple of years use someone found a mountain sheep (ram) skull in a nearby cave - thus by fate the name "Camp Rams Head". Never owned by the Boy Scouts but definitely used.

In 1962 and 1963 a couple of gentlemen from California came up and started "Cedar Badge", a special youth training they developed in California. This was done at Vernon Strong's request. These first two years were held at Camp Rams Head. The leftover Rams Head patches were handed out at the first two Cedar Badges. Later Cedar Badge was taken on by Captain Wadsworth.

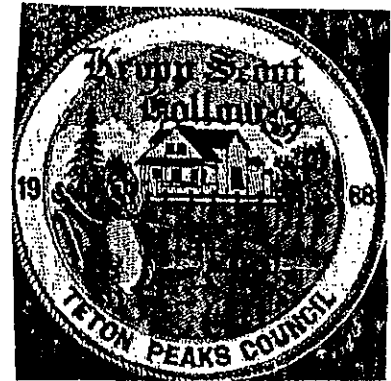
